



## Harrells Christian Academy

### School Description

Founded in 1970, Harrells Christian Academy operates as an independent, college preparatory day school for students in kindergarten through grade twelve. The fifty-acre campus includes lower, middle, and upper school buildings, three science labs, two computer labs, a learning center, an art studio, music room, auditorium, media center, one lower/middle school gymnasium, one multi-purpose building which houses two gym floors and a stage, playground, administrative offices, a field house with fitness center, a lighted football field, a baseball diamond, softball field, four tennis courts, and one practice field.

HCA enrolls 440 students from six counties (Bladen, Columbus, Duplin, New Hanover, Pender, and Sampson). Enrollment in grades nine through twelve is 136 students. Need-based tuition assistance is available.

### Academics

HCA offers the following Advanced Placement courses on-campus: Biology, Chemistry, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, Statistics, U.S. Government and Politics, U.S. History, and Modern World History. Every grade level offers honors-level courses in the core academic subjects. Dual-Enrollment courses are offered online at four local community colleges. Additional course offerings are available online through NCVPS.

HCA operates on a ten-point grading scale. Due to the size of our student body, we believe that class rank is not a strong discriminator with which to predict college performance.

### Assessments

The Pre-ACT is administered to all ninth graders in preparation for the SAT and ACT. The ACT and the SAT are administered to students during their sophomore, junior, and senior years. On-campus ACT testing is offered in the fall of the school year, and SAT testing is offered in the spring of the school year.

### Learning Center

The HCA Learning Center provides a unique and essential service to students with language-based learning differences by offering the Orton-Gillingham teaching methodology. Tuition for The Learning Center is in addition to the regular tuition for HCA.

## College Counseling

The HCA Office of College Counseling provides individual and group guidance beginning in middle school and continuing through each year of high school. A high level of parental involvement is an integral part of the college counseling program. The Office of College Counseling used Naviance from 2011-2020. Beginning in fall 2020, Scoir replaced Naviance.
