As we move into the final grading period of the year, third graders are working through a novel study of *Because of Winn-Dixie* by Kate DiCamillo. They will also be reading and writing poetry and working through their geometry unit in math. In science, students will explore seeds and plants and during social studies they will learn about economics and work towards building financial literacy.

HCA Continues Assessments to Measure Student Performance

Most parents of Harrells Christian Academy children in **grades 3–8** have seen the notation in the school calendar announcing **standardized testing, May 2-4.**

We have given one particular achievement test, the ACT Aspire, each May for the past 6-7 years to gauge how our students are learning in different subject areas. Last year was our first experience with the comprehensive testing by the Educational Records Bureau (ERB). This is an achievement test that, unlike the Inview (which measures their IQ/ability level), measures their mastery of content knowledge at their grade level as compared nationally to their peers.

Who is ERB and what are these tests? ERB is not the name of the test itself. The tests are called "comprehensives" but most schools choose to use the name of the nonprofit educational organization (Educational Records Bureau) which oversees the development, administration, and scoring of tests for more than 1,600 independent and public schools.

The multiple choice test by ERB is a battery of short tests (30-45 minutes each) given in the morning over three days and is designed to provide information about a student's performance in several key areas (depending on the grade level): reading, listening, vocabulary, math, science, and writing.

For many parents and students, these tests evoke a twinge of nervousness and raise questions around how standardized tests will impact our students' lives. We're conditioned through the current news cycle and our own experiences with standardized tests to worry about how these tests will be used and, depending on our scores, how the rest of our lives might be impacted. With those concerns lurking in our minds, no wonder we may find ourselves panicking!

The good news is that, while standardized tests do play a role in our world, much of our concern, particularly around ERBs, is an overreaction. One of the benefits of a school like Harrells Christian Academy is that our children are protected from much of the high-stakes testing (testing with a direct consequence attached to the result-like EOG's/EOC's). We are truly able to use these tests as they were designed—to inform our teaching practice and your child(ren)'s learning.

So, relax-and your children will, too! Just make sure they get a good night's rest, eat a healthy breakfast and dress in layers! We will help them "do their best on their test!"
