In November, HCA will receive a visit from the Southern Association of Independent Schools (SAIS) accreditation team. Harrells Christian Academy has been a SACS/SAIS accredited school since 1975. Accreditation is a voluntary process of self-evaluation and continuous improvement that occurs in a 5-year cycle and delineates standards, and indicators; involves a self-study, and includes a peer review by educators from other schools. SAIS accreditation is designed specifically for independent schools. The process respects and recognizes each school's story, culture, history, and goals, while still fulfilling stringent and focused compliance requirements.
